Mission of the NORMAN network

To enhance exchange of information and collection of data on emerging environmental pollutants;

To encourage validation and harmonisation of common measurement methods and monitoring tools so that the demands of risk assessors can be better met;

To ensure that knowledge on emerging pollutants is maintained and developed by stimulating co-ordinated, interdisciplinary projects on collaborative research and knowledge transfer to address identified needs.

NORMAN legal framework

- Statutes and Internal Rules: needed so we can work together in the long term
- Type of organisation: a non-profit association in line with our mission
- Membership fee: because the network cannot work efficiently with in-kind contribution only
- A voluntary initiative of institutes willing to cooperate on an issue of common interest

WHO (Member) ?

Association will be formed of any juridical entities - except private individuals - from the four groups of stakeholders :

- National Competent Authorities and Reference Laboratories,
- Research centres and Academia,
- Industry and private sector,
- Non Governmental Organisations and Institutional Bodies.



WHAT (Legal commitment) ?

- There is not yet a European law on which to rely for European Associations
- Non-profit association under French Law (Law 1901)
 - easier because two French organisations among Founding Members
 - quite quick procedure



WHY (Subscription)?

It is a voluntary and active initiative of the institute: only partially remunerated by the association's resources

An external observer has free access to the info, data of the network: all data of NORMAN will be public (statutes)

• So why become a member?


A member:

•is an actor in network proposals, decisions and discussions

HOW ? (Structure / organisation)

- more po - after this start-up phase, membership of the network s Steering Committee will be achievable only by election



Ordinary members

- participate in the activities

- make proposals
- have the right to vote
- -pay an annual membership fee

after three years of continuous membership, may seek to achieve the status of Founding Member, in consideration of their contribution to the development of the Association



- do not pay any membership fee

- no right to vote

- may participate in the General Assembly and other activities of the Association with a right to speak, but shall have no right to vote.

- Associate Members can make proposals and act as consultants to the General Assembly and the Steering Committee

Associate members =

Institutional bodies, governmental and international organisations, standardisation bodies and non-governmental organisations



Role of the General Assembly

- brings together all members of the Association

- allows each member to express their position
- determines the general policy of the Association

-has all powers needed for the realisation of the **Association's objectives, and such powers as are** explicitly delegated to the Steering Committee
